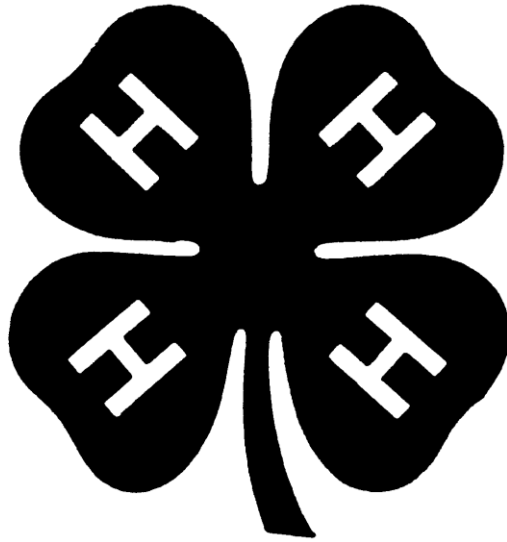

Oregon 4-H Foundation Grants

Each year, funds are available from the Oregon 4-H Foundation to help support the Oregon 4-H program. Grant proposals can be made for:

Innovative Grants Intended to fund 4-H programs that are new, unusual or different. Also, is the idea transferable to other program areas or to other counties? Funds for this grant are from private funds endowed for innovative grants and from funds approved by the 4-H Foundation from unrestricted gifts. Grants are generally between \$200 and \$2,000.

Regional Youth Leadership Grants Grants under this program promote multi-county leadership conferences for youth. These retreats must focus on leadership and include at least two counties. Priority funding will be given to retreats targeted at youth grades 9-12. These grants are funded by a gift from Gene and Gena Fisher. Grants awards are generally \$1,000, depending on funds available.

Chevron USA Community Pride Grants Funded by Chevron USA these grants are offered to 4-H Clubs, regional or county groups to perform local community service projects, which improve their communities. Grants awarded are generally between \$500 to \$1,500.

Grant Application Guidelines

Proposals must include all information listed below to be considered by the Oregon 4-H Foundation for the above grants. Proposals are due in the **Oregon 4-H Foundation office by 5:00 pm on January 1, March 1, and November 1.**

- The complete proposal should include the Grant Application cover sheet, including:
 - What are the project goals and objectives?
 - Who will be served by the project?
 - How will the Oregon 4-H Foundation funds be used?
- The 4-H Foundation Budget Form should include:
 - Estimated expenses for the project
 - Expected funding from other sources
 - In-kind contributions
 - The amount requested for the grant should equal Total Expenses minus expected funds and in-kind contributions.
- A narrative describing the project for which funds are sought. Proposal should address the following items (please limit to 2-3 pages).
 - How was the need for your project determined?
 - What is the timeline for the project?
 - How will you evaluate success of this project?
 - If project is successful, how will it be funded in the future?
- **Publicity.** If your proposal is funded and you wish to announce your grant award, the 4-H Foundation encourages you to do so. The 4-H Foundation appreciates receiving copies of any coverage this grant receives in newspapers, newsletters or other publications. This coverage should be submitted with your final report. Grant award announcements and printed material for your project should include the following statement:

- Awarding of Grants. Decisions to fund grants will be made by the Executive Committee of the Oregon 4-H Foundation at their March, September and November meetings. The grants are reviewed prior to meetings by 4-H staff. The funds will be sent to the grantee during those months.
- Reporting. Upon the completion of the project, a report on the project should be sent to the Oregon 4-H Foundation. Reports could include pictures, and newspaper or newsletter articles about the project.
- Including 4-H Foundation Trustees in the Project. If a Trustee of the Oregon 4-H Foundation lives in your county, they could be informed about the project and included in the project if possible.
